THE AOTA MASAOKI AWARD IN 2018

The award was established in 2014 to honor the memory of the late Professor Masaaki Aota by presenting an award to the best presentation(s) by young scientist(s). Candidates must fulfill the following requirements:

- 1) The presenter is under 40 years of age.
- 2) The abstract must be published in the Proceedings of the International Symposium on the Okhotsk Sea & Polar Oceans.
- 3) Candidates have to be nominated by themselves or by someone else.
- 4) Candidates have not previously been given the Aota Masaaki Award.
- 5) Candidates have to attend the prize-awarding ceremony.
